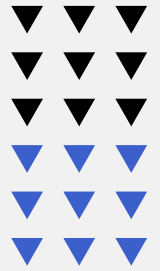


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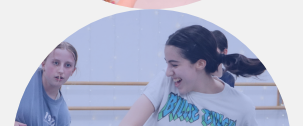

SPECIAL INFORMATION FOR PARENTS OF Discover Dance

The DiscoverDance Early Childhood Dance Program is designed to introduce students to the creative and expressive world of dance. Each class will enhance your child's love of the art form while also learning proper dance terminology, movement concepts, and class etiquette. These classes are educational, fun, and age appropriate!

We are dedicated to providing the highest-quality preschool education in a secure, nurturing, and stimulating environment. Our age-appropriate curriculum, DiscoverDance, and ongoing communication with parents address the physical, emotional, and intellectual needs of our preschool students.

During the first few weeks of classes, we focus on helping students become comfortable with the dance experience, the classroom, teacher, and fellow classmates. Through age-appropriate music, stretching exercises, ballet basics, and creative games, we foster coordination, listening skills, musical awareness, and imagination. Remember, preschool dance is about helping children tap into their imaginations and express themselves creatively, rather than solely learning steps. So don't worry if your child doesn't pirouette around the house right away—it's all part of their dance journey.

The process of separating from parents is an important milestone for preschool children attending dance class. As children grow, they learn to develop an interest in class activities, feel comfortable with their peers, and understand that parents will always come back for them. We understand that some children may initially resist attending class, but it's usually short-lived. Here are some helpful suggestions:

- Focus on the positive aspects of the dance class experience.
- Ensure your child is engaged in an activity or under the teacher's care before you leave.
- Keep goodbyes brief and avoid prolonged farewells.
- Seek assistance from the teacher during the separation process. Remember, any tears shed are often for the parent's benefit.

It's okay if dance class may not be the right fit for your child at this moment. If your child expresses distress or does not want to participate, please don't panic. Pushing children beyond their comfort zones may create negative associations with dance. We never want that. Never force your child into the classroom. If your child discontinues classes within the first month, the registration fee will be credited to the following year. We encourage you to try again next year, allowing your child to grow at their own pace.



What to expect during our first few classes...

We will be introducing class expectations and structure as well as getting familiar with the classroom setting. As each week progresses we will be able to get further along into our lessons. At home, you will begin to see your dancer singing our songs, performing our dances, and even pretending to be the teacher. We encourage you to PLAY along and help us continue the FUN and EXPLORING outside of the dance class!

A few FAQs to get us started...

Why is my child sitting and watching instead of dancing?

How a child participates in class depends on their unique style of learning. A visual learner will watch the teacher and classmates carefully to process the information being taught. An auditory learner listens carefully to process information. Visual and auditory learners may not move as much as kinesthetic learners. These learners process information by moving and doing.

To avoid distraction in class, and for the safety of those who are attentive with their listening and watching skills, the teacher may ask them to stand or sit to the side. Rest assured, they will be invited to move with the class often and they are still learning. In fact, the visual and auditory learners often take what they see and hear and re-enact the entire dance class at home with their families! All learning styles are accepted, celebrated, and developmentally appropriate.

If my child is crying, should I come in to get him/her?

It is developmentally appropriate for a child to cry the first few days of classes, working through a challenging skill, or struggling with a new concept. We are learning new and exciting things every week. When new things are difficult, big emotions can take over. If your child is upset, the teacher will assess the situation and may hold his/her hand, pick them up (with their permission), or have them sit down by the wall for their safety. They will continuously be invited back to join the fun. If the teacher sees your child is ill or uncontrollably upset, the teacher will bring them out to you. If you open the studio door, peek in, or enter the classroom, you will not only escalate the situation, but you will increase the distraction for the other children in the class. Thank you for your cooperation.

A few more FAQs...

Should I watch my child take class through the open door?

We welcome you to observe your child through our open studio doors. Your support for their dance education is crucial as they grow through our program. However, if your child is easily distracted, we ask that you not observe. Doing so can quickly escalate off-task behavior leading to wasted class time. You know your child best. We appreciate your assistance in helping us create an environment where attentive learning can take place.

Should I stay in the lobby during the class?

Parents and guardians of young children must remain in the lobby for the duration of the class. We are not responsible for changing diapers/pull-ups or assisting your child to the restroom. In case of an emergency or any situation that may arise, your child may need you. Please do not leave them unattended.

We are late for class. When should we enter the studio?

Being late for class is going to happen, and it's ok! Oftentimes rushing to get to class on time can cause a child to become anxious or upset. If this sounds like your child, it's important to reassure him/her that they will not be in trouble and it's ok to be late sometimes. When you arrive, remaining calm will help your child remain calm. Don't forget hugs and kisses before quietly sending your child into class. To avoid off-task behavior for the rest of the students, it is best to enter between songs or activities. If you are unable to consistently arrive on time, please speak with us to find a class that is more suitable for your schedule.

LOBBY RULES:

To make this year a great success, we ask that you go over our lobby rules with your dancer while they wait for their dance class to begin.

- Dancers MUST go to the restroom before entering the studio.
- Absolutely NO running anywhere in the studio.
- No jumping, hanging, or tapping on the studio doors.
- No standing or jumping on the benches.
- Keep voices down so classes are not disturbed.
- Absolutely no one is allowed behind the front desk except staff.

UNDERSTANDING DANCE EDUCATION

As a parent, your support is invaluable to your child's dance journey. Encourage them to be the best version of themselves, focusing on their own accomplishments rather than comparing themselves to others. Dance is an individual art form, and each student progresses at their own pace. Our dedicated faculty not only teaches technique and steps but also imparts essential life lessons. Through dance, children learn commitment, teamwork, and the rewards of hard work. Our goal is to educate their minds, bodies, and souls, providing them with skills that will serve them well in all aspects of life.



Class Placement

Our experienced faculty carefully considers each student's progress and placement. Placement decisions are based on years of teaching expertise and aim to promote self-esteem and confidence. We also believe dancers should be placed in their age groups. We understand that every child is unique, and factors influencing placement are complex. Trust in our faculty's judgment and encourage your child to embrace their class with enthusiasm, regardless of the level. Our priority is to provide a positive and empowering environment for each dancer.



Medical Information

Your child's well-being is of utmost importance to us. Please inform the director and teachers of any medical conditions, learning disabilities, or medications your child may require. Our teachers are trained professionals who are eager to work with all children, and the more we know about your child, the better we can provide a fulfilling dance experience. Rest assured that all information regarding our students is treated with the utmost confidentiality.



Do's and Don'ts

It's natural for parents and students to draw inspiration from others, but let's focus on personal growth rather than making comparisons. Encourage your child to celebrate their achievements and avoid speaking negatively about teachers, fellow students, or other parents. Our faculty takes their role as mentors seriously, guiding students to act respectfully towards their peers, adults, and themselves. If you have questions or concerns, please reach out

directly to your child's teacher or the director. Misinformation can be avoided by seeking accurate information from the right sources.

STAYING INFORMED



We strive to make the dance experience organized and enjoyable for everyone involved. To keep you well-informed, please read all newsletters and studio updates carefully. Newsletters and important updates will be emailed to you and posted in our private Band App. If you have any questions, feel free to contact our office during business hours or send an email. Our website is regularly updated with essential information, and our Band App is a great resource for daily updates and connecting with the dance community. DRESS CODE

At VERSA5, our dress code is designed to foster focus, inclusiveness, and equality among all dancers. By adhering to a uniform dress-wear, we create an environment where teachers can assess technique, alignment, and other crucial aspects of dance training effectively. Let's embrace the dress code with confidence and unity!

To ensure organization, students are required to carry their dance-wear, shoes, and belongings in a designated dance bag. Please remember to label your child's bag and all its contents with their name. Let's keep our dance-wear in excellent condition by regularly laundering and maintaining it.

During classes, we kindly request that students avoid wearing watches, jewelry, and safety pins, as they can be distracting. Dance shoes should never be worn outside to preserve their quality and cleanliness. Female students are encouraged to secure their hair tightly and neatly away from their faces, preferably in a tidy bun. Maintaining good personal hygiene habits, including the use of deodorant for students aged 10 & older, is expected from all dancers.



DRESS CODE

REQUIREMENTS

DISCOVERDANCE (all levels): leotard dress, classic pink tights, and classic pink leather ballet shoes. Boys should wear black ballet leather shoes, shorts, and a white t-shirt.

KINDERCOMBO: leotard dress, classic pink tights, and classic pink leather ballet shoes. Boys should wear black ballet leather shoes, shorts, and a white t-shirt.

BALLET: Black leotard, classic pink tights, and classic pink ballet shoes. *(Levels I and II require leather; Levels III, IV, and V require canvas.)*

JAZZ: Black leotard, short or leggings, dark tan tights, and slip-on dark tan jazz shoes.

TAP: Black leotard, shorts or leggings, dark tan tights, and tap shoes. *(KinderCombo and Level I require black leather mary jane tap shoes. Levels II, III, and IV/V require black tie tap shoes.)*

CONTEMPORARY: Leotard, shorts or leggings, convertible tights, and bare feet.

MUSICAL THEATER: Black leotard, shorts or leggings, dark tan tights, and dark tan jazz shoes.

HIP HOP: Comfortable clothing and clean sneakers. (No baggy pants or jeans.)

REGISTRATION FEE & TUITION



To ensure smooth operations and provide necessary coverage for insurance and administration, we have an annual registration fee. The fee is \$25 per student, \$40 per two students, or \$50 for three students or more and is required at time of registration. It's a small investment that helps us create an amazing dance experience for everyone. Please note that registration fees are non-refundable, except for preschool students who may receive a credit for the following term if they are deemed unready for dance.

When it comes to tuition, we want to make it as convenient as possible for you. Monthly tuition is due by the first of the month. You have the flexibility to make payments at any time and in any amount that suits you best. If you consistently make regular payments and have a credit, we'll apply it towards the next term.

For Season VII tuition costs, please refer to the provided information. You'll find all the details you need in your family portal within StudioLAB. We strive to make financial matters straightforward and transparent, so please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any questions or need assistance.



FEES AND TUITION

2023-2024 SEASON

Season VII is 36 weeks of dance instruction starting Monday September 11, 2023. Each month's tuition is for four weeks of dance. Full tuition is due every month regardless of attendance and/or holidays. Monthly tuition is never prorated. One month's tuition is due at the time of registration as a deposit. This will be used for the last month's tuition of Season VII (June 2024). VERSA5 will not send monthly statements. Reminders will be sent out if payment is late. Deposits and monthly tuition are non-refundable. All student accounts must have a credit card on file. This card may be used for automatic payments (with authorization) or as a means to collect payment on delinquent tuition. All payments will cease at the season end and students must register for each session (Season VII September-June, Summer Session)

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

At VERSA5, we value punctuality and safety for all our students. We kindly ask students to arrive 5-10 minutes before their class begins, allowing them to settle in and prepare for an amazing dance experience. To ensure the safety of our young dancers, children under the age of 10 should be picked up promptly after their class. For students aged 10 and older, we kindly request that they are picked up no more than 10 minutes after their class ends. Please understand that we are unable to assume responsibility for students before or after their scheduled classes, so it's essential for parents to ensure timely drop-off and pick-up.

We understand that unforeseen circumstances or emergencies may arise, causing delays. If you find yourself in such a situation, please contact the studio immediately. Our priority is to keep your child calm and safe until they can be collected. Your communication is crucial, and we appreciate your cooperation.

ATTENDANCE

Every class at VERSA5 is a step forward in the educational journey of our students. Regular attendance is essential for continuous progress and growth. Starting in January, choreography for the year-end performance will be taught and rehearsed. It's crucial for children to feel completely confident with the choreography and their performance. Missing classes during this period could lead to frustration for the students, their teachers, and their classmates. We encourage all students to prioritize their dance education and make attending classes a top priority.

TARDINESS

Dance is a physical activity that requires a properly warmed-up body to ensure safe movement execution. Students who arrive late miss out on the essential warm-up and/or barre exercises, which may increase the risk of injury. To prioritize the safety and well-being of our students, those arriving more than 10 minutes late may be asked to observe the class. We want all our dancers to enjoy their dance journey while staying safe and injury-free.

CLASS VISITORS:

For the safety of our students and to fulfill our legal responsibilities, we are unable to permit visitors in the classroom during regular class sessions. Students should refrain from inviting siblings, relatives, or friends to their classes, except for special events such as Holiday Week and in-studio performances. These occasions offer a unique opportunity for sharing the joy of dance with loved ones.

MAKEUP CLASSES:

We understand that unforeseen circumstances may cause a student to miss a class. To ensure they don't miss out on the valuable learning experience, we offer the opportunity to make up the missed class with a similar one. Please reach out via email, and our team will guide you in determining the best makeup class for your child. Make-ups may be scheduled until the end of January.

LOST AND FOUND:

We know how easy it is for dance wear, shoes, and personal items to get misplaced. To avoid any confusion, please make sure to label all your child's belongings with their name. We will make every effort to locate and return lost items; however, we kindly ask for your understanding that we cannot be held responsible for any items your child brings to class.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION:

Emergency evacuation routes are clearly posted throughout the studio and reception area. In the event of an emergency, students will calmly and quietly evacuate in a single file to the designated area. Our dedicated teachers will take attendance to ensure everyone's safety. Students and teachers will return to the building only when the all-clear signal is given, indicating that it is safe to do so.

ILLNESS:

The health and well-being of our students and staff are of utmost importance to us. We kindly request your cooperation in keeping our dance community healthy. If your child exhibits any of the following symptoms, we kindly ask that you keep them at home to prevent the spread of illness:

- Fever
- Consistent cough
- Severe sore throat
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Pink, burning, itching, or discharging eyes

If these symptoms or any other contagious conditions are observed in your child during a class, we will promptly contact you to arrange for their immediate pick-up. When your child has a fever, please keep them at home until their temperature returns to normal and after 24 hours. Furthermore, if there are any lingering signs of illness such as glassy or watery eyes, listlessness, or drowsiness, we kindly request that you keep your child at home. This precaution will ensure that the illness has fully passed, and your child will be well enough to fully participate in class activities the following week.

CAR PARK SAFETY:

At VERSA5, the safety of our dance family is our top priority. When entering and exiting our building through the parking lot, we kindly ask everyone to exercise extreme caution. Please be mindful of the presence of children of all ages. It is essential to park only in designated parking spaces and avoid parking in areas that are not intended for vehicles. Additionally, we kindly request that you refrain from idling your car if parked in close proximity to the building or its windows. As well as, turning off headlights in the evening to avoid blinding our staff and dancers through the studio windows. For the safety of all, we kindly ask that siblings do not play in the parking lot. Let's create a safe and secure environment for everyone to enjoy.

At VERSA5, we prioritize safety, punctuality, and the well-being of our dance community. We appreciate your cooperation in adhering to these guidelines, which contribute to a positive and empowering dance experience for all.
